- Today, UCP of Greater Cleveland is a high impact, thriving organization that provides direct services, information and supports for children and adults
- A leader in its field, the agency meets the complex health and social challenges associated with a wide range of disabilities including but not limited to cerebral palsy, spina bifida, acquired brain injury, spinal cord injury, multiple sclerosis, muscular dystrophy and intellectual disabilities
- Programming remains focused on maximizing individual client functioning and integration into the community

our mission

- UCP of Greater Cleveland provides a continuum of care to individuals with disabilities ranging from early intervention for infants to lifelong adult residential and vocational supports
- Through comprehensive and responsive programming, the agency strives to meet the mission to empower children and adults with disabilities to advance their independence, productivity and inclusion in the community

our programs

- Three major facets of programming are offered, including Children's Services, Adult Vocational Services and Adult Residential Services
- Programs are accredited and licensed, and are held to the strictest standards of quality



UCP provides services to over 1,500 children and adults each year

children's services

- Children's Services programming is based on the philosophy of early intervention and family-focused care. Highly qualified staff provide a range of services designed to promote physical, mental and emotional development through the use of cutting edge equipment and treatment modalities
- Traditional Therapy Services include physical, occupational and speech/language therapies for infants and children with disabilities
- Steps to Independence® is a unique, intensive, multi-disciplinary therapy approach that helps children with cerebral palsy and other motor disorders achieve higher levels of functioning
- School-Based Services provide physical, occupational and speech/language therapies, as well as training to local school districts on a contractual basis
- Early Intervention Service Coordination is offered in partnership with the Ohio Help Me Grow Program and targets children from birth to three years who have or are at-risk for developing a disability
- Parent Education offers support services and educational modules for parents and caregivers
- Assistive Technology Services are offered in conjunction with each Children's Services program to enable children with disabilities to more effectively interact with their surroundings



vocational services

- Vocational Services offer a wide range of employment, socialization and habilitation programming to assist individuals with disabilities in overcoming barriers to community integration
- Organizational Employment allows individuals the opportunity to earn income in a supported environment at the agency's on-site workshop
- Adult Day Support assists adults with moderate to severe disabilities to maximize or improve their development and quality of life
- Community Employment provides appropriate resources that allow individuals with disabilities the opportunity to work in an integrated community setting
- Assistive Technology Services provide equipment and instruction to use technologically assistive, adaptive, and rehabilitative devices to enhance clients' quality of life and ability to communicate and interact with the surrounding environment

residential services

- Residential Services provide individuals with disabilities the opportunity to live the most productive and meaningful life possible within the least restrictive environment
- The Independent Living Program (ILP) offers supported living services and health care support for individuals residing in a community-based apartment or house of their choosing. Support is tailored to individual need and preference
- Edendale House and Memphis House are two group homes, each providing personal care, health care and daily supports around the clock, in an effort to allow adult clients to live as independently as possible

Programming is available on-site and in community and residential settings



UCP of Greater Cleveland partners with various businesses to offer a range of work settings and job placement opportunities for individuals in the Community Employment Program

UCP of Greater Cleveland's programs are accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF), an independent accreditation organization that promotes excellence in rehabilitation services based on clearly defined, rigorous and internationally accepted standards of quality

The agency is a certified provider for Medicare and Medicaid
