about vocational services

- UCP of Greater Cleveland is dedicated to ensuring that adults with disabilities are able to live the highest quality of life possible and maintain maximum independence and functioning
- Vocational Services offers community employment, as well as facility-based employment, socialization and adult day support services to assist individuals sixteen years of age or older in overcoming barriers to employment and inclusion in the community
- Services are client-focused and service plans are developed with full involvement of the individual
- Qualified staff coordinate support services and ensure proper implementation of individual service plans, including referrals to both in-house and community resources for physical, occupational, speech/language therapies and assistive technology evaluations and training



organizational employment

- UCP of Greater Cleveland's Organizational Employment Program offers individuals with moderate to severe disabilities the opportunity to earn income in a supported environment
- Individuals receive a paycheck based on productivity for piece-rate work completed at the agency's on-site workshop and/or computer lab
- Training and supports are available to help individuals develop appropriate work habits and productivity
- Work may include secure document shredding, light assembly, packaging, collating, bulk mailing, data entry and a host of other jobs
- The program also offers assistive technology devices and training
- An array of social, recreational and educational activities are offered to broaden client experience and enhance communication skills including
 - Art Therapy
 - Aqua Therapy
 - Music Therapy
 - Exercise and Wellness Programs, such a Wheelchair Tai chi
 - Gardening
 - Sensory Stimulation
 - Cultural and social events
 - Client interest clubs and projects
 - Community library outreach
 - Community outings to museums, parks, libraries, sporting events and cultural events

adult day support

- Adult Day Support assists individuals with multiple and severe disabilities to gain, improve upon and keep skills which contribute to a high quality of life
- Individuals are encouraged to interact with friends and peers while receiving support in areas such as mobility, activities of daily living, personal care, community awareness and emotional growth
- An array of social, recreational and educational activities encourage participants to experience the community and be an active part of the surrounding environment
- Well-trained direct care professionals with high staff to participant ratios allow staff to meet the complex needs of each person effectively



community employment

- Specialized skills training is available to prepare individuals for employment in a variety of work settings, including computer and technical training
- Participant needs are assessed through a person-centered planning process and reviewed periodically for progress in meeting employment goals
- Individuals are placed in the least restrictive work environment possible, based on employer needs and client preferences and can include both supported group employment and competitive placement
- For high school students with disabilities transitioning into employment, Project SEARCH, a component of the Community Employment Program, offers business immersion internships during the student's final year of high school to prepare them for the workforce
