- OakLeaf Day Services provides high-quality assistance to people with high medical needs and multiple physical disabilities.
- All locations are pleasant, safe and caring environments that focus on cleanliness and comfort. Flexible daytime hours run Monday through Friday.
- Every day brings interactions with peer groups, intergenerational groups, volunteers and OakLeaf employees.
- Activities meet client interests and encourage personal development, focusing on integration into the community.

- We develop personal goals that improve quality of life, including physical, mental and social goals.
- OakLeaf Senior Day Services is a specialized program for seniors with disabilities who are 50 and older.
 Programming includes activities that appeal to seniors and provides opportunities for intergenerational events and community integration.



- Client employees participate in paid employment in a workshop setting doing light assembly, secure document shredding, packaging, sorting and collating, bulk mailings, data entry and janitorial duties.
- Clients work at the agency's on-site workshop, a clean, safe and supported environment with flexible daytime hours, Monday through Friday.
- Employment-focused training builds hard and soft job skills that prepare clients to move into a communitybased job.
- Assistive technology evaluations and training are available to support employment and community integration goals.

- Clients also participate in inclusive activities that serve their individual interests and encourage vocational and personal development.
- Community outings and center-hosted activities help clients engage with peer groups, intergenerational groups, volunteers and the rest of the community.



- OakLeaf Partners supports adults with disabilities to find and retain jobs in the community, either as part of a supported team or in individual competitive employment.
- Clients are placed in jobs that have the least restrictive work environment possible, based on employer needs and employee preferences.
- OakLeaf Partners collaborates with OakLeaf Job
 Training to provide skill-building that can serve people
 with complex needs find work in their communities.

SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT

- Clients join a team working at a community business, with ongoing support from an on-site OakLeaf supervisor.
- Before being placed, clients engage in career exploration and work skills assessments to evaluate their job preferences and skills.
- Clients work in the community, receive a wage at or above minimum wage, accrue vacation and short-term leave, and receive holiday pay.

INDIVIDUAL PLACEMENT

- People with competitive-level skills get the support they need to identify, apply for and obtain jobs in the community.
- OakLeaf Partners helps them discover work preferences, learn job-seeking skills and receive travel training to ensure they succeed on the job.
- Job coaches provide on-the-job training for each client and work with their employer to identify accommodations to ensure the employee's success.



OAKLEAF TRANSITION SERVICES—PROJECT SEARCH AND SUMMER YOUTH WORK EXPERIENCES

- Project SEARCH is a one-year school-to-work transition program for students with disabilities in their final year of high school.
- The program is in a business setting where student interns attend class and work in multiple internships throughout the business. Course work includes employment-related topics such as money management, appropriate workplace behavior and job search techniques. A licensed special education teacher provides instruction, and an OakLeaf job coach provides support during three internship rotations.
- Through a variety of internships, students acquire competitive, transferable and marketable job skills while exploring a variety of career paths.
- An OakLeaf job placement specialist works with each student to help them seek and retain employment within six months of graduation.
- OakLeaf Partners Transition Services also helps high school students with disabilities gain work experience during the summer at businesses throughout Northeast Ohio. This is the first community-based work experience for many students.



- OakLeaf provides 24-hour personal care and support that enable clients to live as independently as possible within the community.
- The goal is to ensure that people with disabilities live the most productive and meaningful lives possible in the least restrictive environments.
- Locations on both the East and West side of Cleveland specialize in serving people with significant disabilities and medical challenges.
- Clients' needs are assessed and reviewed periodically to make sure they are making progress in quality of life and community integration.
 - Residents are encouraged to participate in outside activities including work, school, recreation, social activities and volunteerism to enhance their self-reliance and decisionmaking capabilities.
